FIGURING OUT WHAT TRUE RICHES ARE ALL ABOUT

THE BIG IDEA

If anyone teaches false doctrines and does not agree to the sound instruction of our Lord Jesus Christ and to godly teaching, ⁴he is conceited and understands nothing. He has an unhealthy interest in controversies and quarrels about words that result in envy, strife, malicious talk, evil suspicions ⁵and constant friction between men of corrupt mind, who have been robbed of the truth and who think that godliness is a means to financial gain. ⁶But godliness with contentment is great gain. ¹Timothy 6:3-6 (New International Version)

- The gospel is not a product that leads to wealth and happiness.
- Godliness and contentment are the two basic ingredients of true riches.

Contentment = autarkeia = self-sufficiency = <u>satisfied</u> with what God has provided, no matter what it is.

CONTENTMENT PRINCIPLES

My attitude about what I have is far more important than what I have!

People who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge men into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs. 1 Timothy 6:9-10 (NIV)

- . . . though your riches increase, do not set your heart on them. Psalm 62:10c (NIV)
- ... the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches and the desires for other things enter in and choke the word, and it proves unfruitful.

 Mark 4:19 (English Standard Version)

Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. ¹²I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. ¹³I can do all things through him who strengthens me. Philippians 4:11-13 (ESV)

Danger Signs of Loving Money

	You're more concerned about making it than how you make it.
	There's never <u>enough</u> . □ You tend to <u>flaunt it</u> . □ You resent <u>giving</u> it.
	You are often disappointed with God's supply.
	Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." ⁶ So we say with confidence, "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can man do to me?" Hebrews 13:5-6 (NIV)
0	Our <u>eternal destinies</u> have nothing to do with wealth.
	For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it. 1 Timothy 6:7
	" a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions." Luke 12:15b (NIV) (See also Job 1:21)
0	Contentment must be <u>learned</u> .
	But if we have food and clothing, we will be content with that. 1 Timothy 6:8 (NIV)
	Key to contentedness is to distinguish between what we want and what we need.
0	Actively pursuing God is the cure for the disease called "Love of Money."

But you, man of God, flee from all this, [talking about the love of money] and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness. ¹²Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses. ¹³. . . I charge you ¹⁴to keep this command without spot or blame until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ . . . 1 Timothy 6:11-16 (NIV)
