Humility Philippians 2:1-11

If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, ²then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose. Philippians 2:1-2 (New International Version)

May God . . . help you to live in complete harmony with each other—each with the attitude of Christ Jesus toward the other." Romans 15:5 (New Living Translation)

This passage explains how three destructive attitudes destroy unity and how a spirit of humility brings God's people together.

• First Destructive Attitude: "SINCE I'M <u>BETTER THAN YOU</u>, I DESERVE TO GET MY OWN WAY."

Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Philippians 2:3 (NIV)

Selfish ambition = a greedy attempt to gain the upper hand = <u>selfishness</u>

Vain conceit = the pursuit of personal glory = pride

Humility = an awareness of one's true state

Consider = to calculate or to reckon

Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another . . . Romans 12:10 (New King James Version)

Ways to Grow in Humility

- Listening (James 1:19; Proverbs 18:13)
- Seeking <u>forgiveness</u> (Matthew 5:23-24)
- Forgiving others (Colossians 3:12-13)
- Reminding yourself of <u>your mistakes</u>

Therefore, as God's chosen people . . . clothe ourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another . . . Colossians 3:12-13a (NIV)

• Second Destructive Attitude: "<u>MY INTERESTS COME FIRST</u>—NO ONE ELSE'S ARE AS IMPORTANT."

Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. Philippians 2:4 (NIV)

Look = (Greek) *skopeo* = <u>to contemplate</u>, to fix one's eyes upon

Second element of humility = to <u>promote the good of others</u> even at personal expense

"But among you, those who are the greatest should take the lowest rank, and the leader should be like a servant.²⁷Normally the master sits at the table and is served by his servants. But not here! For I am your servant." Luke 22:26, 27 (NLT)

• Third Destructive Attitude: "I NEED TO ALWAYS <u>STAND UP FOR MY</u> <u>RIGHTS</u>."

Your attitude should be the same that Christ Jesus had. ⁶Though he was God, he did not demand and cling to his rights as God. ⁷He made himself nothing; he took the humble position of a slave and appeared in human form. ⁸And in human form he obediently humbled himself even further by dying a criminal's death on a cross. Philippians 2:5-8 (NLT)

The final element of humility = voluntarily <u>giving up my rights</u> for the good of others

Jesus "did not consider it robbery to be equal with God." (NKJV)

Because of this, God raised him up to the heights of heaven and gave him a name that is above every other name, ¹⁰so that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. Philippians 2:9-11 (NLT)
