What Are You Thirsting For? John 4

Now he had to go through Samaria. ⁵So he came to a town in Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of ground Jacob had given to his son Joseph. ⁶Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about the sixth hour. ⁷When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" ⁸(His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.) ⁹The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.) ¹⁰Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." John 4:4-10 (New International Version)

"Living water" = flowing water = something that would quench the thirst of her soul

"If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink." John 7:37b (NIV)

WHAT ARE PEOPLE THIRSTING FOR TODAY?

(Thanks to Bill Hybels for suggesting these ideas.)

• #1: PEOPLE THIRST TO UNDERSTAND THE MEANING OF LIFE.

"Existential" question relates to questions about our existence.

For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: TO AN UNKNOWN GOD. Now what you worship as something unknown I am going to proclaim to you. Acts 17:23 (NIV)

• #2: PEOPLE THIRST FOR **COMMUNITY**.

For my people . . . they have turned away from me, the spring of fresh water, and they have dug cisterns, cracked cisterns that can hold no water at all. Jeremiah 2:13 (Good News Translation)

Cisterns = chambers to collect rain water

• #3: PEOPLE THIRST TO BE CLEAN.

... God, give grace! ... wipe out my bad record. Scrub away guilt, soak out my sins in your laundry ... scrub me and I'll have a snow-white life." Psalm 51:1, 7 (The Message)

Christ suffered for our sins once for all time. He never sinned, but he died for sinners to bring you safely home to God . . . 1 Peter 3:18 (New Living Translation)

... I no longer count on my own righteousness ... rather, I become righteous through faith in Christ. For God's way of making us right with himself depends on faith. Philippians 3:9 (NLT)

• #4: PEOPLE THIRST FOR A GRANDER <u>VISION</u>, SOMETHING BEYOND THEIR OWN LIVES.

Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets." Luke 5:5 (NIV)

His partners, James and John, the sons of Zebedee, were also amazed. Jesus replied to Simon, "Don't be afraid! From now on you'll be fishing for people!" ¹¹And as soon as they landed, they left everything and followed Jesus. Luke 5:10-11 (NLT)

"Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? ¹² Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his flocks and herds?" ¹³ Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴ but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." John 4:11-14 (NIV)

"Living water" = spiritual life found in Jesus Christ = eternal life

"Drinks this water" = <u>receives Jesus Christ</u>; places faith in Him

Prayer to receive Christ and quench your spiritual thirst: "Father, forgive me for trying to fill my thirst with everything except You. I believe that the resurrected Christ is offering me living water. I receive Jesus and what He offers. I receive forgiveness for my sins and new life. I give myself to You."
