pachad (paw-kkad')

"But he stands alone, and who can oppose him? He does whatever he pleases. ¹⁴He carries out his decree against me, and many such plans he still has in store. ¹⁵That is why I am terrified before him; when I think of all this, I fear him." Job 23:13-15 (NIV)

• arats (aw-rats')

The LORD Almighty is the one you are to regard as holy, he is the one you are to fear, he is the one you are to dread. Isaiah 8:13 (NIV)

phobeo (fob-eh'-o)

"I tell you, my friends, do not be afraid of those who kill the body and after that can do no more. ⁵But I will show you whom you should fear: Fear him who, after the killing of the body, has power to throw you into hell. Yes, I tell you, fear him." Luke 12:4-5 (NIV)

• tromos (trom'-os)
