"How To Be Perfect Before God"

Luke 18:9-14

Then Jesus told this story to some who had great confidence in their own righteousness and scorned everyone else: ¹⁰ "Two men went to the Temple to pray. One was a Pharisee, and the other was a despised tax collector. ¹¹ The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed this prayer: 'I thank you, God, that I am not a sinner like everyone else. For I don't cheat, I don't sin, and I don't commit adultery. I'm certainly not like that tax collector! ¹² I fast twice a week, and I give you a tenth of my income.' ¹³ "But the tax collector stood at a distance and dared not even lift his eyes to heaven as he prayed. Instead, he beat his chest in sorrow, saying, 'O God, be merciful to me, for I am a sinner.' ¹⁴ I tell you, this sinner, not the Pharisee, returned home justified before God. For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." Luke 18:9-14 (New Living Translation)

The Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector tells us **two ways to pursue righteousness** and gain a right standing with God.

• RIGHTEOUSNESS THROUGH WORKS (See Luke 18:11-12)

Righteousness through Works is Wrong for Three Reasons

- It uses performance to gain standing with God.
- We compare ourselves to others and not God.
- We are unrighteous <u>sinners</u>. (See Romans 1:18-3:20)
 - ... all people, whether Jews or Gentiles, are under the power of sin. ¹⁰As the Scriptures say, "No one is righteous—not even one. Romans 3:9-10 (New Living Translation)
 - ... all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ...
 Romans 3:23 (English Standard Version)
 - ☐ If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. . . . ¹⁰ If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, . . . 1 John 1:8, 10 (ESV)
 - "If they sin against you—for there is no one who does not sin— . . . ⁴⁷yet if they . . . ⁴⁸ . . . repent . . . ⁴⁹then hear . . . their prayer . . . ⁵⁰and forgive your people . . . "1 Kings 8:46-50 (ESV)

Two Metaphors about Our Righteousness

They are <u>soiled garments</u>.

We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment. Isaiah 64:6a (ESV)

- They are garbage. (See Philippians 3:8)
- RIGHTEOUSNESS AS GOD'S GIFT (JUSTIFICATION) (See Luke 18:13)

How to Pursue Righteousness as God's Gift

- See your sin by comparing yourself to Jesus and His Word.
- See your own righteousness as insufficient before a holy God.

... "My destruction is sealed, for I am a sinful man and a member of a sinful race. Yet I have seen the King, the LORD Almighty!" Isaiah 6:5 (NLT, 1996)

Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the worst.

1 Timothy 1:15 (New International Version)

- Humbly repent.
- Receive the righteousness of Christ as a gift.

However, to the man who does not work but trusts God who justifies the wicked, his faith is credited as righteousness. Romans 4:5 (NIV)

But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. ⁹Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! Romans 5:8, 9 (NIV)

For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. 2 Corinthians 5:21 (ESV)
