## **OUT ON A LIMB FOR JESUS**

Luke 19:1-10

Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through. <sup>2</sup>A man was there by the name of Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was wealthy. <sup>3</sup>He wanted to see who Jesus was, but because he was short he could not see over the crowd. <sup>4</sup>So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree to see him, since Jesus was coming that way. <sup>5</sup>When Jesus reached the spot, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today." <sup>6</sup>So he came down at once and welcomed him gladly. <sup>7</sup>All the people saw this and began to mutter, "He has gone to be the guest of a sinner." <sup>8</sup>But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, "Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount." <sup>9</sup>Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. <sup>10</sup>For the on of Man came to seek and to save the lost." Luke 19:1-10 (New International Version)

Jesus came to seek and save the lost. And after <u>we've</u> been found and saved, Jesus calls us to go out on a limb to seek the lost and introduce them to Jesus.

## This passage challenges us in two specific ways:

## JESUS WAS INVOLVED WITH PEOPLE

- We must go. Let's get out of our comfort zone.
- We must see. Notice the individual, not just the crowd.
- We must care. It takes time.

**QUESTION**: How many non-believers are you in relationship with?

## > JESUS WAS INTENTIONAL

- We must eliminate barriers. Treat them with **r**espect.
- We must build **l**'elationships as a bridge between them and Jesus.
- We must be intentional in bringing them to a **r**esponse.

**QUESTION**: What are the barriers (internal and external) that keep us from building relationships with those who need Jesus?

**QUESTION**: What's one action I can take this week to "go out on a limb" for Jesus?
