Big Idea / **Sermon in a Sentence:** Our internal allegiance shapes the contours of our life with God and others.

What causes quarrels and what causes fights among you? Is it not this, that your passions are at war within you? ²You desire and do not have, so you murder. You covet and cannot obtain, so you fight and quarrel. You do not have, because you do not ask. ³You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions. ⁴You adulterous people! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God. ⁵"Or do you consider that the Scripture speaks in this meaningless way: 'the Spirit he made dwell in us yearns with sinful jealously?' ⁶But he gives more grace. Therefore it says, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." ⁷Submit yourselves therefore to God. • There is an internal root to our relational problems.

You do not have, because you do not ask. ³You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions. James 4:2b-3 (ESV)

You adulterous people! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God. ⁵"Or do you consider that the Scripture speaks in this meaningless way: 'the Spirit he made dwell in us yearns with sinful jealously?' ⁶But he gives more grace. Therefore it says, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." James 4:4-6 (ESV and <u>The Message of James</u>, J.A. Motyer)

• Our God, who loves us deeply and fully, cannot be indifferent in whom (or what) we put our trust.

Three questions to consider:

- 1) Do you find yourself growing more in love with Jesus over the years?
- 2) Do you find yourself more willing to give control of your life to God?
- 3) Do you find yourself more free with your time, talent and treasure over the years?

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. ⁸Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. ⁹Grieve and mourn and weep. Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your gladness to gloom. ¹⁰Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you. James 4:7-10 (ESV and <u>The Message of James</u>, J.A. Motyer)

Our internal allegiance shapes the contours of our life.

Four major sub-points in verses 7-10:

- 1) Are you with Me?
- 2) Transformation always involves the hands and heart.
- 3) Emotions should flow from conviction.
- 4) God loves to love on the humble.

TIPS:

- 1) Don't be paralyzed in fear of not including God enough.
- 2) What one does matters less than why one does it.
- 3) Try a "prayer practice" this week. Make a list of the top 10-15 things in your life. Create some space to bring your list to God. Pray Psalm 143:8 - "Let the morning bring me word of your unfailing love, for I have put my trust in you. Show me the way I should go, for to you I entrust my life. Having prayed, pay attention to any invitations from God and/or any resistance you might feel surface.
- 4) Nothing beats community discernment.
